

More things than the above are happening at Debenham URC and by way of an update this is where we are now.....

We gained permission to make some changes to the United Reformed Church in Debenham so that we can make the building more accessible to those not familiar with "Church". Also, the changes to the interior means that we can expand the use of this valuable space for the use of the local community.

To this end the membership have raised over £50,000 to have the whole building re-wired, a fire alarm system installed, new lighting and state of the art heating installed. This bar a few tweaks has now been completed.

The next phase is to have most of the pews removed, leaving some as an example of the original decor and levelling the floor. This will reveal a huge space opening up many possibilities for all sorts of activities.

After this, the plan is to widen the foyer into the church making a social space for more informal gatherings.

After the removal of pews the rest of the work is estimated to cost another £100,000 for which we are having cake sales, and one of our more brave male members, Chris, is doing a sponsored luminescent hair colour which he will sport for a month. So if you see a gentleman, who really ought to know better, sporting bright pink hair around Debenham, you will know it is for a good cause! He has raised over £2500 so far. 

# Monday Community Brew


